Dear Mr Connelly

Thank you for your letter of 28 January in response to Lord Gill's further invitation to you to submit any factual information relevant to his Terms of Reference by way of addition to your previous written communications.

You appear to have misunderstood the position. The Chairman has carefully taken into account your written submissions to the Inquiry and kept them under review. He has never suggested that your written submissions have been omitted. The nature of the Inquiry has been such that the Chairman has received the majority of evidence in writing.

The actions you took in respect of the concerns you had in respect of Health & Safety matters are a matter of record, as are the actions taken by HSE.

None of the Core Participants, amongst whom were bereaved family members and injured survivors, of whom a large number were represented by Thompsons, a firm experienced in workplace matters, applied for evidence to be heard based on your submissions.

The regulatory issues in so far as they fall within the Terms of Reference are receiving the Chairman's careful attention. If you have any evidence that you have not previously provided the Chairman has requested me to renew his invitation to you to send it in as soon as possible.
